

Make a Throne for Him

“The Body of Christ,” to which we respond with a strong “Amen” after which the Priest will give the person Jesus, present in the Eucharist. There are two ways in which we can receive.

Prior to Vatican II everyone would receive the Eucharist on their tongue while they knelt at the communion rail. There are some people who still like to receive communion on the tongue, some kneel and some stand. This is a beautiful devotion to our Lord present in the Eucharist. That is one option for receiving communion.

The second option is to receive Jesus on your hands. Vatican II made this an option for people to receive Jesus this way. For those who wish to receive on their hands there is a very specific way in which we do it to show reverence for our Lord.

We make a throne with our hands and the priest (or extraordinary minister) will place Jesus in your hands. This throne is made by stacking your hands, palm up, with your dominant hand on the bottom. This is so that after Jesus is placed on your hand, your dominant hand reaches over, picks up Jesus off of your other hand, and places him into your mouth. This is a reminder to all of us that it is our Lord who we are receiving.

There may be times when we are not able to use both of our hands to receive Jesus. A hand might be occupied by a child, cane, temporarily out of commission by an injury, etc. If you are not able to use both hands, then I would ask that you receive on the tongue. This removes the awkwardness involved with either trying to grab the Eucharist with our free hand, pop Jesus into our mouth like a breath mint, or do the awkward maneuvers to move Jesus from our palm to our fingertips. I will post a brief and humorous video to our parish app and Facebook page that a parish did about reverently receiving holy communion.

So, as we come to receive our Lord in the Eucharist, we are enthroning him in our hearts, and if we receive on our hands, in our hands as well. God bless.
