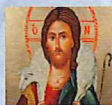

Blessed are the poor in spirit

I have written in my last couple of reflections how our culture does not align with our Catholic faith. There are many ways in which our culture has shifted so that it runs contrary to our faith. The goal of our culture is to build a paradise here on earth, and it will change or destroy anything that contradicts that illusion. We believe that our paradise is in heaven. This seems like a slight difference, but it leads to very different results. It is like a long math problem where a small mistake in the beginning equals a big mistake in the end. I think that it is important to call to mind these differences, so that we can know the challenges that we face.

I have taken a lot of this from the book, "From Christendom to Apostolic Mission." It is written by Monsignor James Shea and others, and it is an excellent read. I recommend it because it explains this much better than I have the room to do here. It is a very hopeful book that makes the case that we are going through a cultural shift. This means that we must change the way that we live out our faith.

A couple of generations ago, people lived in a culture that for the most part moved along with the Christian understanding for life. It made it easy to be Christian and to pass along the faith to your kids. All that you had to do to teach your kids the faith was take them to church, faith formation classes or a catholic school, and they learned by absorbing what was all around them. We and our children still absorb what is all around us, but we must think and act differently when what is around us leads us away from Jesus.

Our current culture seeks to create paradise in the here and now. It is governed by this belief that if we all just do "these certain things" then we can be perfectly happy here and now. We can be rich in everything that we need, and we will desire nothing outside of our grasp. This also means that we have no need for God because we can do it all ourselves.

Jesus' statement of "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven," is the opposite of this. The poor in spirit know their need for God. They know that they are hollow apart from God. We feel this emptiness when we are apart from him as this longing and loneliness that the world cannot satisfy no matter how many pleasures it throws at us. Those that are poor in spirit come to be with Him and he fills them to overflowing with his abundance. It is like being a hungry child who sits on his Father's lap at enormous feast. So long as the child sits on the father's lap, he feeds the child with the abundant food that is present before them. The child then continues to work and play close by the Father so that the Father can still give him bites from the Father's food.

The culture wants to feed us straight sugar whereas the Father wants to feed us rich food that satisfies our souls. We want to be nourished by the Father and cut out the garbage that we take in from our culture. We do this by making the sacraments pillars of our lives. We also feed this work by praying with the scriptures "Lectio Divina." This will help us come to know the riches that the Father provides. It also will help to keep us from being led astray by a culture that leads us away from God

Lectio Divina

Complete the usual preparatory steps for prayer. Relax, become aware of God's presence, ask for the saints to help, and name a specific grace or graces and then:

Step 1. Lectio (Reading)

What it is: Slow, attentive reading of a Scripture passage.

How to do it: Read the text slowly and prayerfully. Focus on becoming familiar with the text and noticing words and phrases that resonate with you.

Step 2. Meditatio (Meditation)

What it is: A deeper reflection on the chosen word or phrase, moving beyond the outward sense to its spiritual meaning.

How to do it: "Chew on" the words. Ponder the word or phrase that caught your attention. Consider what it means to you personally, and how it connects with your life, thoughts, and experiences. This is the **A**cknowledge part of relational prayer.

Step 3. Oratio (Prayer)

What it is: A natural conversation or response of the heart to God, prompted by your insights from meditation.

How to do it: Speak to God from your heart. Tell him about the things you noticed in the previous step. Express your thought, feelings, and desires that have arisen. Tell the Lord what is going on. Be completely real with him. Don't hold anything back. Tell him about your anger, fear, agitation, and joy. Tell him about even the small stuff. Let it all out. Notice how he seems to respond. Stop talking and listen. Be confident that he will communicate with you. Open yourself to a response. Feel his presence if you can. Is there a peaceful thought that keeps coming? A memory? A new or changing feeling? A gentle tug in one direction? An echo of a different scripture? Let God's presence and action wash over you. He is doing something even if you don't feel it. This is the **R**elate and **R**eceive part of relational prayer.

4. Contemplatio (Contemplation)

What it is: A resting in God's presence, a deep connection where one moves beyond thoughts and words to a profound spiritual encounter.

How to do it: Rest in God's presence and receive his loving embrace. Words are not necessary. This is a time for stillness. Just let yourself be loved. When you finish, journal, and answer all four questions. This is the **R**espond part of relational prayer.

Here is the information about Lectio Divina that I preached about last Sunday. It may seem a little rigid at first, but it is like any new skill, the more that you do it, the easier it becomes. You will find that as you become more familiar with the scriptures you will learn the Lord's voice and how he is speaking with you. If you are wondering what passages in scripture to pray with, here are some good places to start.

- Psalm 139
- Psalm 63
- Psalm 130
- Isaiah 40: 28-31
- Jeremiah 1: 4-9
- Philipians 4: 4-9
- Luke 5: 1-11
- Matthew 9: 27-30
- John 21: 15-19
- Luke 9: 57-62
- Luke 5: 18-25
- Matthew 16:13-17

If you want more passages, I can get more for you. These are a few that can give you a starting point if you feel overwhelmed and do not know where in the bible to start. When you start praying with the scriptures, it will change your faith life forever. The Lord desires to pour himself out abundantly to us, so do not fear to draw close to him through the scriptures. God bless.

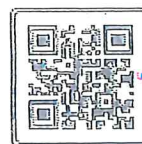
