

You are the Light of the World


The homily that I remember from college seminary eleven years ago was the rector saying, “you are not here by chance, God has called you here for a reason.” That line stands out as an encouragement to combat any fear that the last few reflections that have brought up. I want to point out that you do not live in this time and place by chance. God has put you here for a reason and given you the talents and gifts that can help to build up his kingdom in this time and place.

Last week I spoke about how our culture has shifted from aligning with our Catholic values to actively working against them. This shift necessitates a shift in how we live and raise our families. In previous generations, many families taught their kids the faith by taking the kids to mass on Sunday, catechism on Wednesday, and the culture taught them all the rest. This is not a critique of previous generations, but it was a mindset of “we will teach you this as you go.” It was not an unrealistic expectation because most of the values that parents wanted to teach their kids were a part of the culture that they lived in. However, the culture no longer forms our children to live and practice the faith. This culture that works contrary to the faith is not just in major cities far away, but there are also elements of that in our own state and towns. The point of this is, we cannot expect our children to absorb the faith from the culture around them. They will absorb things, but those things will NOT help them to live their faith.

The family is sometimes called “the domestic church” by Vatican II. This means that the family is like a miniature version of the Church. The family is meant to reflect the Church in your life together. “Thus, the home is the first school of Christian life and ‘a school for human enrichment’ (CCC 1657).” In short, parents are the first teachers of the faith to their children both by what you do and the words that you speak. If we want our families to be Catholic, we must take an active role in teaching them and filtering the influences of the culture.

Parents: I know that you have a thousand things on your mind, but I will pose two questions for you to ponder. The first, what is the mission of your family, or what is the ultimate goal that you are striving for in your family? The second question is, do the things that you do, emphasize, and spend your resources on, lead you towards that goal? Do they lead you to becoming saints?


Jesus calls us to be light to the world. This means that living in a non-Christian culture, our lives and families will look very different than the world around us. It may seem very daunting to be light to the world, then let us start with our families. Let us start by building up and strengthening the faith in our families. This can be done by praying together, reading scripture, and by seeking to deepen your own knowledge of the faith so that your faith can deepen. I also find especially nowadays that teaching your children the faith is not just what, but why we believe what we do. I believe that our Catholic faith is important to you, and you desire that your children would know and love our faith. It is also important to recognize that teaching your kids this faith may need to look different than how you learned it growing up because our culture looks different from when we grew up. In short, we are seeking to teach our children the richness of our faith and to love the Lord. So, do not be afraid, for God will equip you for the task that he has entrusted to you.
