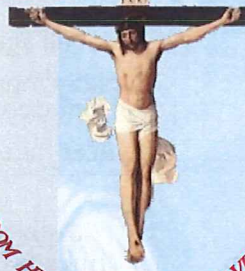

Thursday, 10:00am @ Immaculate Conception

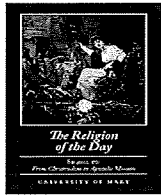
All are welcome to attend! It takes about 10 minutes of your time but connects you to Him whose mercy is unfathomable.

Wonder and Awe

There is a phrase that says, “Beauty is in the eye of the beholder.” This essentially means that everyone gets to decide what is beautiful to them. While it is true that different things appeal to different people, I think that this phrase is hogwash. I say that it is hogwash because, beauty is not merely determined by the person who sees it.

There is something about true beauty that draws us outside of ourselves. It is like staring at a breathtaking sunset, and you want to inhale every bit of the sky that seems to be on fire around you. Things that are truly beautiful inspire this sense of wonder and awe. They make us stop and want to just bask in this moment for as long as we can make it last. So much so, that even when it ends there is this lingering presence of the moment that we want to hold onto, to cling to. This is true beauty, and it helps to lead us to God.

We see in our gospel Peter’s moment of awe at the astounding catch of fish that the Lord has provided. I imagine that there is this moment where he is just standing there taking it all in before he tells Jesus to depart because he is a sinful man. This moment of pause, of being receptive, and trying to take everything in, gives us this little taste of eternity. This little taste of just wanting to receive from our Father who wants to give us everything.

It is important to find and to look for these moments of awe and wonder. When we encounter these moments, tell Jesus thank you for this moment to share with him. We live in a world of rushing, getting things done, and doing what is most practical. Our world does not value moments of awe and wonder. It doesn’t value those moments because those moments remind us that everything we see in the world around us is passing away.

This world of passing things and to-do lists is not the most important thing. It is not our final goal. So, seek those moments of awe and wonder. Cultivate them, treasure them. They are a way of connecting with the Lord and allowing him to share these moments with us.
