

“A Whole New World”

I'm sure that a few people read the title and had flashbacks of the movie Aladdin (the kids movie from the 90's, the remakes do not count). The rest of you figured that Father has lost his mind and both groups of people could be right... time will tell.

I wrote last week that in teaching your kids the faith it is not merely what we believe, but also why. This is also true if you are trying to go deeper in your faith. Learning our Catholic faith is not just learning a bunch of rules or beliefs, it is learning a new way to see and understand the world around us.

In the book, “From Christendom to Apostolic Mission,” Msgr Shea uses the term “imaginative vision” to describe the way that we see and make sense of the world. Another way to think of it is like lenses in a pair of glasses. It is a way in which we view the world, and like someone who wears glasses all the time, we do not think about it. This imaginative vision is a set of assumptions that we take for granted. It gives meaning, helps us to understand the world around us, and it helps us to sort and prioritize things. It is the inner narrative that provides a sense of meaning and direction to individuals, groups, and societies. We often absorb this vision from the world and culture around us. The problem is that our culture promotes a vision that contradicts our Catholic faith, so if we wish to deepen our faith, then it is helpful to purify the parts of our vision that conflict with our faith.

One piece of the vision of our culture is that the physical world is the only one that matters. If you cannot sense something, then it does not exist. There is a focus upon living this life as if there is nothing afterwards. Do what makes you happy because you do not know what will happen tomorrow. The evil one also adds in this lie of, “if you never try these pleasures, you will regret missing out.”

Seeing the world from our Catholic worldview is different. We know that we live in two worlds, so to speak, a physical one that we can see and a spiritual one that we cannot. Between the two, the spiritual world is more real than the physical one. The physical world is passing away but the spiritual world is composed of the Creator and creatures that have no end (i.e. God, angels, humans). This physical world is the testing ground to see who we love more, God or ourselves. The greatest pleasures here on earth pale in comparison to the joy and the glory of the life to come. This vision of the world is the foundation for our moral life and beliefs. “But without faith it is impossible to please God, for anyone who approaches God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him” (Heb 11:6). It makes no sense to live the moral life if this world is all there is. However, because we believe that God does reward us for following his commandments and loving him with our whole mind, heart, and soul, then we can follow him. We can believe that he offers something far better than what is offered here on earth.

Looking at the world through a Catholic vision makes it seem like “a whole new world” because everything takes on a new meaning and importance. Just like in the movie, love makes you see the world differently, so seeing the world with a Catholic lens is like seeing “a whole new world.” Our decisions today are forming us for eternity, so let us compete well, for our heavenly Father rewards those who seek him with their whole heart. The glory that he gives is beyond what our minds can imagine.
