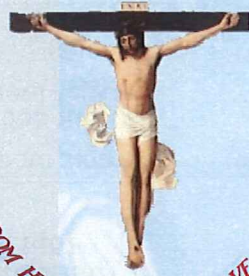

## Is Christ raised from the dead?

“If Christ is preached as raised from the dead, how can some among you say there is no resurrection of the dead?” St. Paul raises the central question for this weekend’s readings. The question is, where is our true home, is it earth or heaven? These might seem to be unrelated questions, yet they are intimately tied together.

St. Paul gives his rhetorical flare to make the point to the Corinthians. There is a life after death and Christ is our hope of entering into that new life with him in heaven. This is the central point of our faith that makes everything that we do make sense. It is why we give up time every Sunday to come to mass. It is why we deny ourselves to live out the moral law that God has given us. It is why we humble ourselves by coming to confession to receive forgiveness for our sins. We do these things and many more because we believe that Christ has risen from the dead, and by becoming saints here on earth, we will be rewarded in heaven. That is why for the Catholic, the way that we view the world is different from everyone else.

By contrast our world takes on a view that this world is everything. There is nothing after this, so we ought to do one of two things. Either we should strive for an earthly utopia (which is impossible), or we should enjoy every moment and pleasure that this life has to offer. “Eat, drink, and be merry for tomorrow we die,” as the saying goes. The Catholic viewpoint stands in opposition to this worldview, and that is part of why the two are always at war.

Jeremiah says that the person who trusts in the Lord is like the tree planted beside running waters. Even amidst the heat and the drought, it still bears fruit. We should not live in fear that the world is going to hell in a handbasket, nor the hope that one man with bleach blonde hair will bring about this utopia. We live, move, and work in this world, while keeping our gaze fixed on heaven. The goal of this life is to get us into the Kingdom of Heaven in the next. So, the things of today are of little importance and great significance in so far as they bring us closer to becoming saints. For we believe, “Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.” St. Paul also says, “The sufferings of this life are as nothing compared with the glory in the new world to come.” Let us keep our gaze and our strivings focused upon heaven. For the things of this world can never fully satisfy our hearts, that long for heavenly glory.
