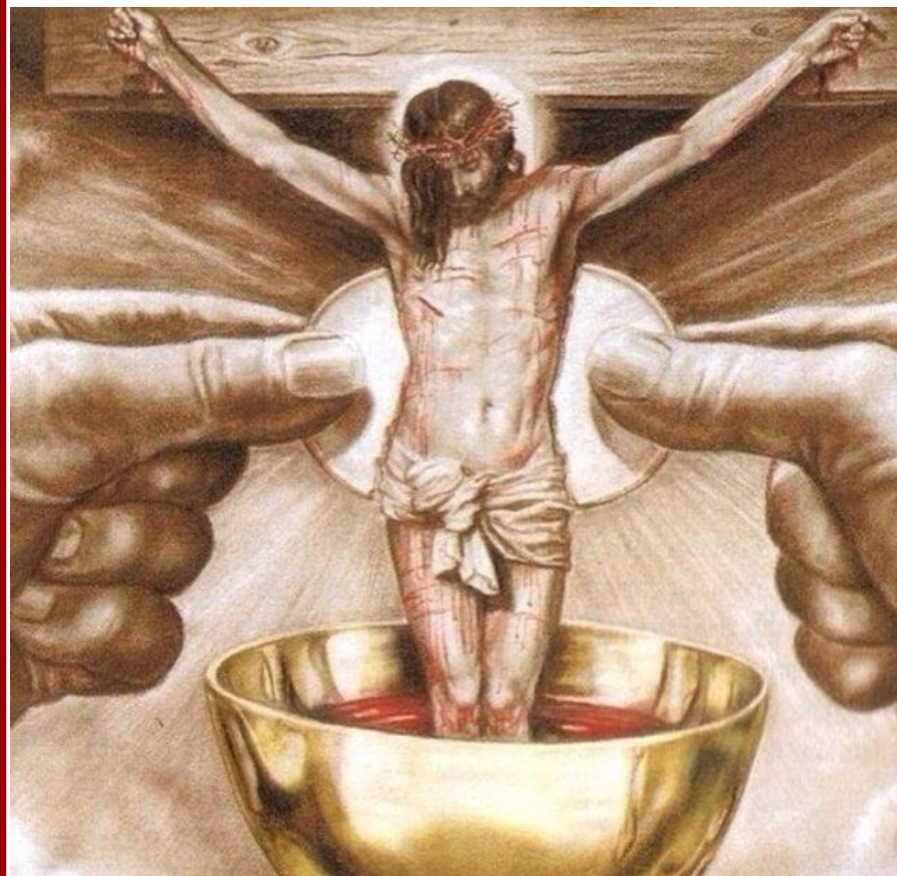


The Eucharistic Remedy

“Communion is the remedy for our fallen state.” Some people may remember this from last Sunday’s homily. I spoke about how God wants to heal us through the sacraments. I used the example that the Eucharist works to bring about communion between us and God, one another, and within ourselves. The Eucharist is a remedy for the fallenness of man; yet it can only do this if we are in a “state of grace.”

Some people may wonder what being in a “state of grace” means. Simply put, it means that we are in right communion with God. When we commit mortal sin, grave matter committed knowingly and freely, we sever our relationship with God. We turn our back on him for a lesser good and this breaks the relationship. We can repair this relationship through confessing our sins in the sacrament of confession. This is the way that Christ has established for the forgiveness of mortal sins. So, when we have mortal sin on our soul, we are not in a “state of grace.”

This is important to note because when we are in mortal sin, or not in the “state of grace,” we cannot receive the healing graces that God wants to give us in the Eucharist. This is not because God does not give grace, but because we are not able to receive that particular grace until we are restored to the “state of grace.” Mortal sin limits our ability to receive those graces given in the Eucharist. This is why we priests love confession because it frees people of their burden of sins that prevent them from receiving the graces that God desires to give them.



This is also why I push the importance of weekly Sunday mass. It is our medicine and remedy for the effects of sin and brokenness that we have all inherited from our first parents. The Eucharist is not our award for doing things perfectly, but the remedy to our weaknesses. It is not magic though. It only works as a remedy when we are in a “a state of grace” so that we are open to receive the remedy that Jesus provides each and every week.
