

**Blessed Ann Catherine Emmerich has much to share about Christ's passion and death. From a very young age, this saintly person received visitations from the child Jesus. It was so normal for her to converse with Christ during his visitations that she believed this happened to everyone. In her lifetime she received on her body the stigmata, the miraculous wounds of Christ's passion. Along with the stigmata came incredibly vivid visions of the suffering and crucifixion of the Lord. She witnessed the sorrow and faithfulness of Mary, the Mother of God. Her miraculous visions inspired the details of the movie, *The Passion of The Christ*, which became one of the most popular cinematic works on the subject. The Mel Gibson movie drew much of its inspiration from the book titled, "The Life and Revelations of Ann Catherine Emmerich". This is an incredible source to help draw the faithful onward into the mystery of our Lord's cross. I wholeheartedly recommend anyone add this book to their Lenten discipline, and use it along with the Gospel readings on the account of the Passion. It will challenge anyone, no doubt, but that is part of the point of Lent. Christ is inviting each of us to a more abundant share in his suffering. Sometimes that means we need to see more clearly what he did in the flesh in order to understand. Arguably, Blessed Ann saw more than just about anyone else. Order her book and see what God revealed.**

Like ours, his human nature is destined for eternal life; but unlike ours, it is perfectly exempt from sin, the cause of death. Above all, his human nature has been assumed by the divine person of the 'Author of Life,' the 'Living One.' By accepting in his human will that the Father's will be done, he accepts his death as redemptive, for 'he himself bore our sins in his body on the tree.'" —Catholic Catechism 612


