



Priests of the domestic church

Have you ever wondered why our culture is waging such a brutal war on men? It is not by chance. It is an intentional, calculated undermining of husbands and the role that they have been given by God. I use the title of husbands because their first duty is to be a husband then a father, even when they have children. Their role is to be priests of the domestic church (the spiritual leader of their family). This attack happens by portraying husbands as incompetent, fools, and the one who holds back his strong, independent wife. Why does the evil one make these attacks on men? The answer, “How can anyone enter a strong man’s house and steal his property, unless he first ties up the strong man? Then he can plunder his house. (Mt 12:29)”

God gave to husbands this job of being the priest of his family. This means that he is to be the spiritual leader, guardian, and head of his family. This authority is not to lord it over them, but to serve. Many people dislike the passage of Ephesians 5:21-33, because it states that the man is head of his family. However, that responsibility comes with the command to “love your wife even as Christ loved the Church.” He is to lay down his life so that his wife and children may be brought safely through the gates of heaven. I am not trying to tear down women or say that they are less. But I want to call out how the evil one is trying to remove husbands from their spiritual role so that he may cause chaos in their families. The evil one does not merely want to wage war, but he also wants to mock the Lord as he does it. The evil one wants men to believe the lies: they do not have a role, they are unsuited to the task, or they are too busy with work. The evil one wants us to believe these lies, then the guardian is removed from the family.

Husbands, you have a role that no one else can fill. You have been given the gifts and graces for this task. (I say with great reverence that not every situation is ideal. Some families this may not be possible so the mom is doing the best that she can. This is not criticizing their efforts.) It is a call to the husbands to lead by your actions and your words. This is not to say that you do this solely alone, your wife is meant to be your helpmate and support in this task. But you are given the crucial role as a leader and guardian.

Some may say, “I do not know how to fulfill this role, or I was never taught how to do this.” The example for us can be St. Joseph. Some of the titles for St. Joseph are Foster Father of the Son of God, Head of the Holy Family, and Terror of Demons. He is the model for what it means to take on this role of leader and guardian of your family. He can teach you how to be a priest of your family. By our own power this is an impossible task. If we wish to be the priests of our families, then we must be men of prayer. We find the strength to do this through being rooted in a life of personal prayer and frequent reception of the sacraments. “All things are possible for God. (Mt 19:26)”

This cultural war on men is because they have been given this crucial role to play. God has entrusted the souls of your family to your leadership and care. I encourage you to build a relationship with St. Joseph who was entrusted with the Holy Family. He can be your teacher and example for how to be the strong man so that your house is safe.
