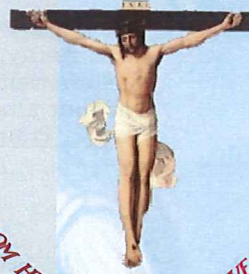

Spiritual Warfare

The first Sunday of Lent always begins with the gospel of Jesus being tempted in the desert. This is a reminder to us that we are soldiers in the spiritual life. We are at war with the evil one, the world, and our own wounded nature (what St. Paul terms “the flesh”). We do not fight alone, but we have the Lord to assist us. We use the weapons of the spirit for spiritual warfare.



“Remember who you are.” It sounds like just a corny line from a Disney movie, but remembering is essential for soldiers on the battlefield and in the spiritual life. If you are attentive, you will notice that on two of the temptations, the evil one attacks Jesus’ identity. He begins his temptation by saying, “If you are the son of God...” This is one of the tactics of the evil one is to move us to forget. He wants us to forget who we are, that we are beloved sons and daughters of the Father, and he wants us to forget all that God has done for us. When he can get us to forget, it is easier to become overwhelmed and to fall into the trap that he has set for us. This is why the Church helps us to remember who we are.

There are a few things that can help us to remember. The first is keeping a spiritual journal and writing down in it the blessings that the Lord has given us. We can then look back on these graces when we experience times of trial to remember that the Lord will act and provide his grace to us. This remembering is also why Jesus calls us to come to mass each week as a reminder of who we are. When I pray the Eucharistic prayer (I usually use Eucharistic Prayer III if you care to read along), within that prayer it speaks about remembering. “Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the saving Passion of your Son, his wondrous Resurrection...” This remembering of the work that Jesus has done, also makes his sacrifice on Calvary present in the here and now. So, this remembering is not just of a past event, but it makes that event present upon the altar in front of us.

There are other aspects to spiritual warfare, but it begins with remembering who we are. We are the beloved sons and daughters of the Father. We are sinners who are greatly loved by our heavenly Father. As we remember, it helps us to stay connected with Jesus who is our strength and our help. We should not fear the battle for as we stay close to Jesus, he gives us all the help that we need to triumph against our enemies of the evil one, the world, and the flesh.
