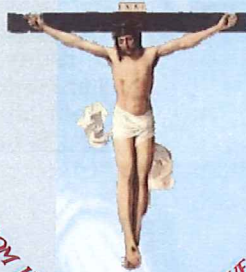

## Freedom from vs. Freedom for

As Americans we speak often of freedom. It is one of our core values that we hold; freedom is also radically important for the Church as well. However, between the popular culture and the Church, there are two different understandings of freedom.

The culture understands freedom as, “freedom from.” This means that we are freer the fewer rules, restrictions, and obligations that are placed upon us. It is this type of freedom that says that I can do what I want, and it is an enticing understanding of freedom. However, it is not the fullest understanding of freedom. Put bluntly, it is an imitation of true freedom.

The Church’s definition of freedom is, the easier that it is for me to choose the Good, the freer I am. Another way to say it is “freedom for,” I am free to do something for someone. I realize that this freedom doesn’t sound as appealing as the first, but because this one is tied to virtue, it truly makes us happier. Virtue is a habit to choose the good. An example of this is when a person cultivates the habit to get up early in the morning. Maybe they do this to have time to get ready for the day or to enjoy some peace and quiet before their kids arise. Whatever the reason, when a person builds that habit, it becomes easy to get up early. There is a freedom or an ease with choosing that good.

Why does this explanation of freedom matter to our readings, because Christ has come to set us free. He didn’t just come to set us free from the consequences of our sins; rather he came to set us free from our attachment to sin. Sin is an imitation; it misses the mark. When we choose sin, we are seeking happiness, but we are choosing the imitation instead of the real thing. It is like choosing a McDonald’s burger and fries over a perfectly cooked steak with all the fixings, it just doesn’t satisfy.

There is this idea of divinization, it means that “God became man so that man might become like God.” We see in the Transfiguration this beauty and glory that God wants to bestow upon us, and it far surpasses our imaginations. God wants to set us free and show us the true beauty and joy that he created us for. As we seek to draw closer to him in lent, he will work to lead us away from sin, from the limitations to the freedom and glory that he wishes to bestow upon us.
