

“Active Participation”

Many people have heard how Vatican II sought to reform the liturgy of the Church, the mass, to encourage the active participation of the people. The phrase “active participation” has become a buzz word in the Church ever since then. So, what does it mean?

In our hyper-busy world and culture to say that someone is active is to say that he or she is getting things done. The person is checking items off the to-do list and conquering tasks. This idea of active means doing things also carries over into our understanding of the mass. We often associate that if I am going to be active at mass, then I need to be doing things. In a sense this is correct, but it does not mean that everyone needs a job. We do need people to help in various roles, but that does not mean that those who do not have jobs are not doing anything. The first role of the priest and the people at mass is to enter the prayer and sacrifice of the mass.

The way that we enter the sacrifice of the mass is to contemplate, meditate, or ponder on the mysteries that are taking place before us. We sometimes tell others that we want to ponder on something to get some space to think. It is work, to ponder deeply on a topic. Mentally, we become like a dog gnawing on a bone. We chew on the readings that are proclaimed at mass, and we bring our offerings to lay at the foot of the altar. We may also switch to chewing on how God wants to be present to us in our activities of the upcoming week or express gratitude for his blessings of the past week.

We also adore the Lord who becomes present under the appearances of bread and wine. This is why we kneel during the Eucharistic Prayer; it is a posture of gazing intently with wonder and devotion upon Jesus. We do all of this and more as we enter wholeheartedly into the sacrifice of Christ which is made present to this specific time, place, and group of people.

So, when we hear the phrase, “active participation,” it is calling all of us to enter and engage more deeply with the worship and work of God happening on the altar. This is not to say that we do not need people to help with lectors, sacristans... etc. It is to remind us that we all participate with the priest in offering our sacrifices and prayers with the perfect sacrifice of Jesus, which is made present on the altar before our eyes.

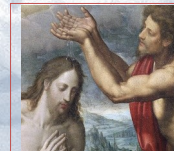
