

“Master, are you going to wash my feet?”

Last week I laid out how the husband is the priest of the domestic church. He is the priest and spiritual head of the family, and the model that we are given for this role is St. Joseph. If you have not read that one, I highly encourage that because the washing of feet builds upon that role of the husband as priest of his family. I want to clarify the meaning of Jesus washing the disciple's feet at the Last Supper, and why I am washing the feet of only men this year on Holy Thursday.

The washing of feet on Holy Thursday is often seen as a symbolic gesture of love your neighbor. However, that was not primarily what Jesus was doing at the Last Supper. It was at the Last Supper where Jesus ordains the first priests, and he institutes the Eucharist. Priesthood and sacrifice (the Eucharist is the perfect sacrifice) are intimately tied together. Jesus is ordaining these men, but they are being ordained to serve the people entrusted to their care.

When Jesus washes the feet of his disciples, he is preparing them for priestly service. “Aaron and his sons shall use it (a bronze basin) in washing their hands and feet. Likewise, when they approach the altar to minister, to offer an oblation to the Lord, they must wash their hands and feet, lest they die. (Ex 30:19, 20-21)” The old testament priests had to wash their hands and feet before serving at the altar. The disciples at the Last Supper would have already washed their hands, but Jesus washes their feet so that they may be prepared for priestly service. This is the way in which Jesus is setting these men apart to serve as his priests.

The tradition of the washing of feet was originally the bishop washing the feet of his priests. Holy Thursday was also the day that priests would renew the promises that they made at ordination. So, it was a reminder of their call to love and serve their people. The missal calls for men to have their feet washed as a reminder of the role that they have been given to be the priest of their family. This role is one of leading by serving those under their care.

What does it look like to be the priest for your family? If we look to the example of St. Joseph, here are a couple of examples. Joseph was a man of prayer, silence, and action. He was a man of prayer who knew when it was the Lord who spoke to him. The different times that God commands him in a dream, when he awakes, he does as the Lord commands. Joseph is a mediator; he brings Jesus and Mary to the temple and offers the sacrifice that the law prescribes for the firstborn son. The priest is meant to be a mediator to bring his people to God and by his words and actions witnesses God's love to his people. We become an image for our families of how the Father sees and loves them. Joseph is a man of silence for we have no recorded words from him in scripture, and cultivating internal silence is how we can hear God speak. There is much more, but the space runs short.

We men, we fathers, we priests (ministerial and baptismal), have a desire for greatness. We desire to love, protect, and serve those who are entrusted to our care. We often do this imperfectly. However, even when we fall short, let us not lose heart at the great call that we have been given, for with God all things are possible. Rather, let us turn to our Father who knows us by name, calls us by name, and says “you are my beloved son.” He equips us with his grace through prayer and frequent reception of the sacraments to lead our families to him.

*O God, who, in your loving providence, chose Blessed Joseph to be the spouse of your most Holy Mother, grant us the favor of having him for our intercessor in heaven whom on earth we venerate as our protector. You, who live and reign forever and ever. Amen.* (from the Consecration to St. Joseph).
