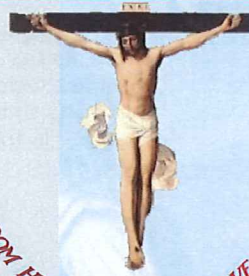

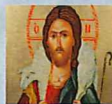

“Go and bear fruit that will remain” Jn 15:16

I wrote last week that Christ came to set us free from sin. It is not just freedom from sin’s consequences but sin itself. Saint Paul says that whoever commits sin is a slave to sin. Just like the Israelites who God set free from Egypt, so Christ has come to set us free. Avoiding sin is not just about “following the rules,” but it is about living in accord with our dignity and bearing fruit.

The word, “sin” is an archery term which means “to miss the mark.” Things are sins because they are beneath the immense dignity that God has given us. It is hard to grasp the dignity that we possess. We are both made in God’s image and likeness, and God has become man to redeem us. He has done this for no other creatures in creation, physical or angelic.

Christ has come to set us free so that we may bear fruit. There is the image of the fig tree in the gospel. It seems fitting to tie to the passage in John’s gospel. “It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain. (Jn 15:16)” Some examples of this fruit can be found in either Saint Paul’s letter to the Galatians 5:22, I’ll let you look that up yourselves. We can also see this bearing fruit as bringing other people to Christ. The Lord desires that all people would know him and be set free by him. Just like he called Moses to lead his people to the Lord and freedom. So, he has also called us to lead others to him.
