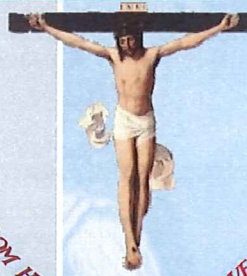

Avoiding the near occasion to sin

In my last bulletin, I laid out one of St. Ignatius' rules of discernment that the enemy searches for our weaknesses and attacks in those places. Building upon that, we shall talk about avoiding the near occasion to sin. We say that we will do this when we pray the act of contrition at the end of confession, but what does that mean.

Avoiding the near occasion to sin means simply that I seek to avoid situations where I am going to need a tremendous effort to avoid falling into mortal sin. Another way of saying this is, "don't set yourself up to fail." An example might look like this.

If I know that I struggle with looking at and watching adult material on the internet at night (adults shouldn't watch it either, but you understand the euphemism). Avoiding the near occasion of sin does not mean that I must destroy my phone or computer, but I avoid going onto the internet or social media late at night. For most all of us we have patterns when it comes to areas where we are weak, whatever that might be. When we are seeking to grow closer to the Lord and avoid sin, the evil one is often not successful in bluntly proposing the full sin. We would say no. He likes to do it by small steps because then we do not notice the ways that we nibble at the bait until he sets the hook. The evil one also tries to bring down our defenses by saying that it will not end like last time. I can nibble at the bait without biting the hook. The problem is, once we nibble at the bait, it becomes harder and harder to avoid taking a bite.

I had one priest give the analogy that temptation is like a snowball rolling down a snow-covered hill. It is easiest to stop the snowball when it is two inches high at the top of the hill. If I wait and let it grow in size and speed, then I am more likely to get run over at the bottom of the hill when it is ten feet tall and barreling down the tracks at me. Then I need to go to confession to restore my soul to a state of grace. This is the case with any mortal sin, not just sins of impurity. The idea put simply is that as much as possible, I avoid getting into a fight or scenario where I am going to lose without a superhuman effort on my part. Another helpful thing to keep in mind is the acronym H.A.L.T. It stands for Hungry, Angry, Lonely, and Tired. When we experience these things, then we are also at a weaker spot. If I know that, then I can be more aware of some of the traps that I may want to avoid.

Saint Ignatius speaks that growing in holiness is not just avoiding temptations and sins, but we can also seek the opposing virtue. For example, if I normally pray for fifteen minutes each day, and today I want to cut it short at ten. Ignatius would say that I keep my normal fifteen minutes of prayer plus one extra minute. Other things that can help us in times of temptation might be saying a quick prayer, exercise, connecting with people we love, fasting, and almsgiving. In short, the things that help me grow in discipline, relationship with the Lord, and relationship with people who push me to be a saint, they connect us to what is real, and avoid the cheap imitation that sin is. When I do these things, it does not mean that I will not experience temptation, but they help us to be stronger when we face them. We may still fall from time to time, but avoiding the near occasions of sin, helps to avoid the hard battles before they start.
