

## A Light for all to see.

Candles can symbolize and point to different things in the Catholic Church. Whether it is the candle that was given to our parents when we were baptized, the candles around the altar, or the devotional candles that we have. Candles are a part of our Catholic tradition and I want to write briefly about some of the different symbols that they are.

When we were baptized, we are given a candle (or it is given to our parents if we are too young to not destroy it). It is given with the words, "Receive the light of Christ." It symbolizes the gift of faith that we have received, and that we must work to keep that flame burning brightly throughout our lives.

Another way in which candles are used in our tradition is to draw attention to things in the liturgy. An example of this is the candles that we have around the altar, tabernacle, and the sanctuary light. The candles around the altar and tabernacle draw our attention. They say, this is going to be a place of great importance and big things are going to happen here so watch closely. The sanctuary light (or the candle in the red globe) tells us that Jesus is present here. When we walk into any Catholic Church if we find the red light then we know where Jesus is at (in some Churches this is more obvious than others J).

We also have our devotional candles off to the side of our church or by a statue of a saint or icon. These devotional candles we can light when we want to pray for a particular person or intention. We have a suggested offering for these candles as a way of making a small sacrifice with our prayer. The candle also can show how we give of ourselves when we offer our prayer intentions.

Candles are a part of our rich tradition as Catholics that point to different symbols of what we believe.

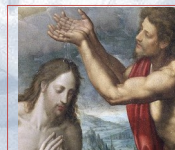
