
Who is it for?

"Father, would you pray for this person?" We priests get asked this question often, and rightfully so. We were ordained to be a mediator or bridge between God and his people. We do this in a very special way when we pray mass, for we are uniting the prayers and offerings of all our people with the perfect sacrifice of Christ. This is why people will have masses said for certain intentions. This is so the graces of that mass, that I offer, will go to that person, family, or need. The way that it works is that people give a small stipend and tell who they want the mass said for. Then it goes on the calendar for me to pray when I pray mass. That fact that it is a paid for intention is important because by church law a priest can only pray mass for one paid intention per day. This intention can be for any person or family who is living or deceased. It can also be for a particular need, that is not contrary to the faith, for example: rain, protection of life, a bountiful harvest, or any number of things.

Some people may not wish to do that, or you might have a great number of people who you know need prayers. The priest is not the only one who can offer mass for a particular intention. All of us by our baptism and participation at mass receive graces from the Lord. We should have an intention in mind for who or what we want those graces to go to. This is what an intention is. I think that having a particular intention in mind for mass can also help us to be more engaged because we are not just watching the priest pray. We are uniting our prayers and offerings with the perfect offering of Jesus to the Father and asking the Father to pour out his grace for our intention.

I am always more than happy to offer the masses that I celebrate for your intentions. If you have intentions that you want me to offer mass for, I invite you to call or stop by the office and we can put them on the calendar. I also encourage you that when you are preparing your mind and heart before mass, think about who or what you want the Lord's graces to go to. For the Lord tells us. "Ask and you will receive, seek and you will find, knock and the door will be opened to you."
