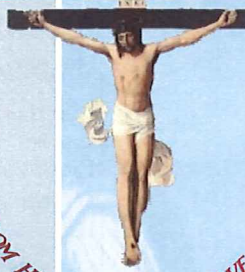

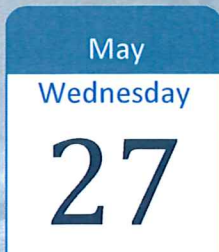

## Forming the whole man (or woman)

There are many things that I love about the Catholic faith. One of them is how all-encompassing God has made our faith. There is a completeness that touches on all aspects of our life, and it shows how beautifully it all fits together. I have often told people that rather than giving either...or answers, the Church gives both...and answers.

Let us flesh this out, make it incarnate, if I may be so bold. I wrote "A Sacramental view of the World," a little while back. Since we humans are made up of both a body and a soul, we live in both the spiritual and physical world. This is foundational for understanding the human person. We need some understanding of this to become saints. Sainthood or holiness is not merely levitating or having profound visions of Jesus, but it is loving God with your whole mind, heart, and soul. The beautiful and daunting part is that this involves our whole person.

When I was in college seminary being formed to be a virtuous man (still a work in progress), the formation was broken into four pillars or areas. This was given to us by Saint John Paul II in his document *Pastores Dabo vobis* (I will give you shepherds). The four pillars of formation are: Human, Intellectual, Spiritual, and Pastoral. This formation is meant to encompass the whole man, not just how he prays. These categories can also be helpful for everyone seeking to grow closer to the Lord by naming different dimensions of our person.

A simple explanation for these pillars would be this. The intellectual pillar is studying, reading, and seeking to form your mind. The spiritual pillar is learning how to pray and building a routine of prayer or life of prayer that becomes foundational to all that we do. The human formation is growing in the virtues, especially the cardinal virtues (prudence, temperance, fortitude, and justice) and theological virtues (faith, hope, and love). We call them cardinal virtues because all the other virtues are encompassed within them. St. Thomas says, "grace builds upon nature," which means that our humanity is the foundation that God's grace builds upon instead of covering over. The pastoral pillar was tying all these things together or integrating them so that we could share them with others. These categories give us a helpful way of breaking down the different aspects of who we are.

The Lord in this process of making us saints wants not only to form us, but also to heal us. All of us have been wounded by sin and the brokenness of this fallen world that is filled with imperfect people. You never know how much you use a certain finger until you injure that finger. Then you try to learn a new way of doing different tasks so that you quit bumping that injury. This applies for other areas of our life too. When we have been injured in friendships or various types of relationships, it changes how we view those relationships, and it affects how we approach future relationships and situations. As we seek to grow in virtue and our life of prayer, the Lord also seeks to heal those wounds of our mind and heart, so they lose their sting and negative affect upon our life.

We may worry, "I have a lot of work to do." However, all these areas are interconnected because we are meant to be an integrated person rather than a cluster of parts. So, the beauty is that as I grow in one area, it builds up other areas in my life. (ex. When I have a habit of exercising, it helps me to be more disciplined in praying and reading a good book, or Father's bulletin, to form my mind.) All of this works together to direct our whole mind, heart, and soul to God. Another reassuring truth is that Jesus wants to work on this one step at a time. So, we do not have to fix everything today. The best way is to take one small step, and the Lord will abundantly bless that effort and help us to grow day by day.
