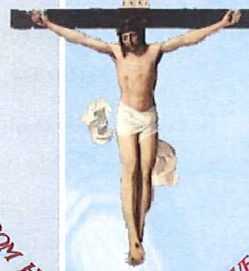

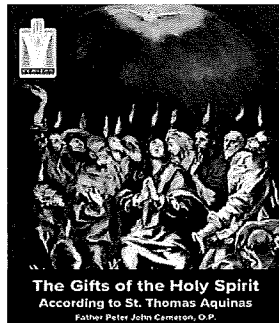

## Overcoming Patterns of Sin

I have written in the past about spiritual warfare and seeking to grow in the spiritual life. As we progress in the spiritual life, we desire to turn away from patterns of sin. This is what the Lord desires, but the enemy does not. The enemy in turn seeks to undermine that task with either some lies or fixing our focus on the wrong things.

The Lord desires to set us free. That freedom is not only from patterns of sin but also lies that the enemy has planted in the wounds of our hearts. These incorrect beliefs can keep us trapped in half-truths that the enemy tells us. Some of these lies may include the following. “You must remove this sin from your life first before God will love you. If I just, try harder then I can fix this. You must have your life in perfect order before your prayer life will grow.” There are other lies as well, but these work to keep us striving to fix things on our own. I can tell you from experience, that never works.

If we want to overcome patterns of sin, our focus should be on deepening our prayer life and relationship with the Lord. This does not mean that the sin does not matter or that we should not keep bringing our sins to confession. The reason that I say focus on our prayer life is because as our prayer deepens and we grow in love with the Lord, his grace empowers us to resist the temptation to sin. The Lord teaches us how much he loves us, and that we do not need to earn his love. As we grow in that knowledge of how much he loves us, we begin to see sin more clearly as it truly is. It is a cheap imitation for the love of God that we hunger for. Prayer strengthens us to make changes in our lives because change is hard.

One priest gave the analogy that someone trying to overcome a difficult pattern of sin could be like telling him or her to drive from here to St. Paul, MN. Prayer is like the gas in the tank of the car. If you are trying to change difficult habits without prayer, it is like trying to drive to the twin cities without any gas in the tank. Prayer is the fuel that helps us to get there. I have alluded in “Give us our Daily Bread” that there are different types of prayer. These three types: vocal, meditative, and contemplative, help us to deepen our relationship with the Lord. It is to make it possible to converse with him like a friend and by spending that time with him the relationship deepens.

Just so we are clear, friendship with Jesus is not meant to be like that friend you text twice every two to three years. It is meant to be like your spouse whom you speak with often, carve out time to be together, and who longs to spend time with you. This is the richness of our faith. All the ritual, discipline, rules, and teachings are meant to bring us into communion, into relationship with the three persons of the Trinity. However, like children, we can see discipline only as rules we have to follow. We only come to realize how freeing this discipline is once we have mastered it and experienced the freedom that it brings.

So, if you find yourself struggling with patterns of sin, the enemy wants you to focus on the sin. That’s like saying “don’t think about the pink elephant.” Then, that is all that you can think of. Rather, Jesus does not dismiss our sin, but he calls us to focus on him. He invites us to learn to listen to him and deepen our love for him. It is living in that love of God that gives us the strength to turn away from sin and the half-truths that the evil one has sown in our minds and hearts. Jesus is like a patient doctor who works tirelessly to heal our brokenness, drain away the lies, and bring us to live in the full joy that he wants for us. He is patient in teaching us that our true identity is that we are beloved sons and daughters of the Father.
