

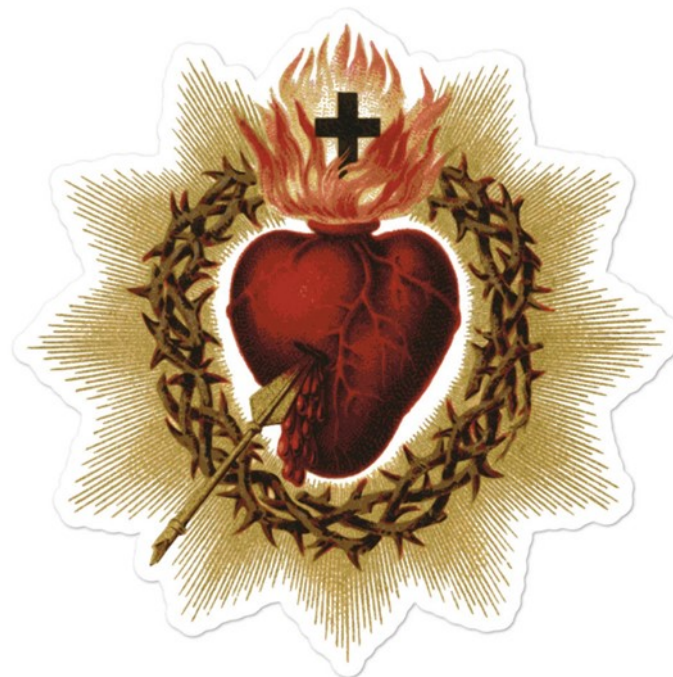
“Adam, where are you?”

In our first reading, it seems like God asks a dumb question. He calls out to the man after they have fallen into sin, “Where are you?” How can an all-knowing God not know where Adam and Eve are hiding?

I read recently that someone said that a more literal translation of God’s question is, “from where do you come?” This question is meant to draw Adam out of hiding after his failure to guard and protect Eve. When they ate of the tree they wanted to know as God knows. Instead, they saw how extremely vulnerable and dependent that they are upon God, and out of that fear they hide. God asks that question of “from where do you come,” to remind him of the great love out of which he was created. God invites Adam not to run from that place of vulnerability, but to step into it and encounter God in that place. It is a reminder to Adam of the great love and care that God has for him.

God leads us in a similar way. As we grow in our relationship with the Lord, he wants us to show him every part of our hearts. It is not only the parts that we are proud of, but also the parts that we are ashamed of, dislike, or even hate about ourselves. If we bring those parts of ourselves to God, we want God to fix them or take them away. We find that these are the places where God tells us, I want to love you there.

There is in our hearts this uncomfortable edge, if you will, where God wants to meet us. Sometimes it can be easier for some to step into that space with God, for others it can be harder, and we may have to wrestle with God like Jacob to come to that place. In either case God calls to all of us like Adam, “from where do you come?” We come from our loving Father, and we are redeemed by his Son, whose Sacred Heart burns for love of us. It is from that deep love that we can step forward to encounter our Father.

To ensure her independence in outreach to victims, she can be contacted at 605-209-3418 (cell). The phone has caller ID and messaging features. All information will be treated confidentially. Alleged victims are advised of their right to report alleged abuse to civil authorities. The diocesan sexual misconduct policy and the code of conduct are posted on the diocesan website at: www.rapidcitydiocese.org. In accordance with diocesan policy, all allegations of sexual misconduct involving children or young people and priests, deacons, lay employees, or volunteers serving the Diocese of Rapid City will be investigated.
