

The meaning of symbols

The original meaning of the word “symbol” in Greek, means “to throw together.” This is a little richer meaning of the word symbol than we normally think of. We normally think of a symbol as something that points to a reality outside of itself. An example of this would be a road sign that says so many miles to Wall Drug. The sign is pointing to Wall Drug and saying to go that way for that distance; you will get to Wall Drug. Wall Drug is not at that sign, though. The sign does not make Wall Drug appear by it, but it just points the way to that destination. This is our common understanding of symbols, that they point to other things, but they do not make those things happen.

Our Catholic faith is full of so many rich symbols, yet our symbols do more than just point to the things that they symbolize. Our symbols

make the things that they symbolize present to us now. The sacraments are a great example of this. In the sacrament of baptism, we pour water over the head of the person to show how the person is cleansed of his or her sins. It is by pouring that water over the person’s head that he or she is washed clean. So, the pouring of water in baptism not only points to the spiritual cleansing, but it causes that spiritual cleansing to take place in the person being baptized.

One of the ways that we can grow deeper in our faith is to learn what these different symbols mean and bring about. As you ponder on the different symbols and gestures that we do at mass, do you know what all of them signify or why we do them? If you don’t know what each one means, make a list, and look some of them up. I guarantee that it will make the mass more fruitful by knowing why we do the things that we do. What are some signs and symbols that you want to learn more about?

NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival
Why a Procession on the Feast of Corpus Christi? Although perhaps not a familiar sight for the past fifty years or so in the United States, Eucharistic Processions on the Feast of Corpus Christi have been an integral part of Catholic culture and practice in many countries. “Processions can be a powerful way to renew and rediscover both belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist as well as the missionary call that every Catholic shares: to bring Jesus to the world.” (Knights of Columbus Procession Guide). Those participating in a Eucharistic Procession proclaim by their actions their desire to follow Jesus and share Him with those around them. Processions provide an opportunity to encounter Christ and deepen their faith.
