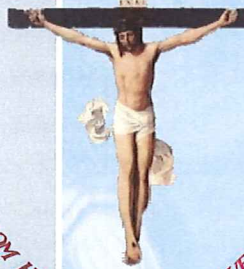

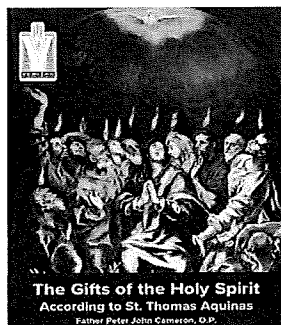

Gratitude to the Father

On a recent day working adventure, I got to gaze on a beautiful scene at the end of the day. You could see the sun walking towards the horizon, the soft breeze making waves in the grass, and the clouds drifting across the sky. I noticed this sense of wonder and gratitude at two things. Firstly, the marvelous beauty that God steeped into his creation. Secondly, that he had created all this so that I could see it at that moment. There was this deep sense of gratitude that as a creature, I am small, inconsequential, and here one day and gone the next. However, I am of infinite value to my Father and so deeply loved by him that he would create that beautiful scene so that I could bask in it for a couple of minutes.

I'm sure that I am not alone in this, but I find that for many of the people that I am truly grateful for, the words "thank you" seem wildly insufficient. The people who have deeply impacted my life, I don't want to just say thank you. I want them to know and feel how much of an impact that they have made in my life. I am sure that we all have people like this. We tell them thank you, and sometimes even get to share a little of the impact that they have made upon us. I have found it brings great joy when I can tell them thank you through words and a gesture that I know will also have deep meaning for them too.

Gratitude is the foundation of the spiritual life. It prompts us to turn our gaze away from ourselves to want to connect with the God who has given us everything. Gratitude and wonder can become a string tugging on our heart that draws us to something, rather someone who is beyond our comprehension, but he desires friendship with us. The more that we cultivate this spirit of gratitude, the more that it enriches our life. I think that one of the problems with our consumer driven world is that it is always pointing out to us the things that we do not have. The action of commerce is not bad in itself, but our world tries to use "stuff" to fill the "God sized hole in our hearts." That is where it runs afoul.

The more that I ponder, the more that I see that our Father has thought and provided everything for us. He has given not only all that we have and are, but He has also given us a way to tell him thank you in a meaningful way. The word, "Eucharist" comes from the Greek word "Eucharistia" which means thanksgiving or to give thanks. When we offer our gifts and offerings to the Father in union with the perfect sacrifice of his Son, not re-sacrificed but re-presented on the altar in this time and place, we tell him thank you in the perfect way. I think that we can sometimes sterilize the mass of its meaning by looking only for what do I get out of it. If it's only what I get out of it, then the days that father's homily was bad, my kids were terrors, the place loud, and I wasn't in the state of grace to receive communion are worthless. Rather, if it is my perfect way to say thank you to the Father, then all the above can occur and mass was abundantly fruitful.

If you want to deepen your spirit of gratitude and experience of mass, then try making a list for mass. Take a little time in the week and write down the things that you are grateful for from that specific week. I think that the more specific that you are, the more fruitful it will be for you. Write that list on a piece of paper, in a journal, or in your phone and bring it with you to mass. Then as you are silently preparing for mass in the quiet time before mass, read through your gratitude list, telling the Lord thank you for all the graces, gifts, and moments throughout the week. Offer them on the altar with the perfect sacrifice that Jesus left for his Church. The Eucharist is the perfect way to give thanks to our Father who showers us with gifts and blessings each day.
