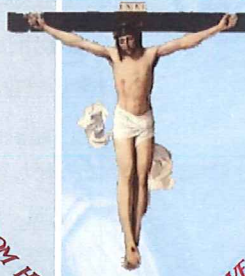

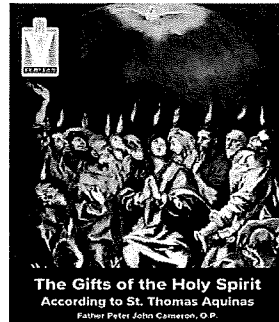

Holy Communion - Proclaiming the Truth

I grew up hearing that phrase that actions speak louder than words. It makes the point that what we do proclaims more than what we say. There was also a sense that whatever you say, you should back it up by your actions. This is immensely important with our Catholic faith because our faith is incarnational, or sacramental, meaning that the spiritual things take place along with physical signs. It ties back to my writing on having “a Sacramental view of the World.” The short takeaway is that the physical actions that we choose to do in this world have spiritual effects in the other world that we are simultaneously a part of. That is the blessing of living with one foot in the physical world and one foot in the spiritual world.

We see this play out with the sacraments, and the names that we call the seven sacraments speaks about what they bring about. Last week I wrote about how the name Eucharist comes from the word meaning thanksgiving. We also sometimes refer to the Eucharist as communion which is also true, and it speaks to a different aspect of this rich sacrament. When we come up to receive communion from the priest or extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, they say “the Body of Christ.” We respond, “Amen.” The word, “amen” means, “I believe.” I am stating that I believe that this is truly Jesus’ body present in what looks and tastes like bread. It is really his body, even though it still looks and tastes like bread. Since the Eucharist is Jesus and he is the source and summit (end point) of our faith, my Amen proclaims that I believe and am striving to live out EVERYTHING that the Catholic Church teaches as the Truth.

When I say that I am in communion with someone, it means that I am in right relationship with them. I am united with them in a deep way. There is a harmony that exists in that relationship. It is like a strong friendship when everything is going well. Similarly, if my friend and I have something come up that strains or damages that relationship, then that communion or harmony is also damaged. It doesn’t mean that the relationship is finished, but we need to fix what is damaged to restore that communion.

This is also true when we receive Holy Communion at mass. I am saying by that action of receiving that I am in right relationship with God. This is why St. Paul says that we must take stock of our relationship with the Lord (discern) before we receive. “Therefore, whoever eats the break or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body, eats and drinks judgment on himself” (1 Cor 11:27, 29). That is to say that if I knowingly receive the Eucharist, while I am not in communion with the Lord and his Church, then I am eating condemnation on myself because I am lying with that action. An example of not being in communion would be if I know that I am not in the state of grace. When I knowingly and freely choose to do a grave or serious sin, then I have committed a mortal sin, and I have cut off my communion with the Lord. We call them mortal sins because like Adam and Eve choosing to eat from the tree that they were forbidden to eat, those sins cause a spiritual death. They cause a spiritual death because we are intentionally choosing to disobey God’s command on a serious matter and it breaks that relationship. If we know that we have separated ourselves from God, then we bring all those mortal sins to confession in number and kind to be absolved, so that communion with God can be restored.

I love that our faith is saturated with meaning, and our actions proclaim our belief to God and the world. So, when we receive Holy Communion, I am proclaiming that I believe and hold all that the Church teaches, and that I am in communion (right relationship) with God.

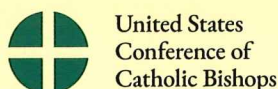
