

## No Coffee with Jesus

There are many questions that often arise about Catholics and why we do or do not do certain things. One that arose recently is why Catholics do not bring coffee, food, or other drinks to mass. There are other denominations that even go so far as to have a coffee bar set up in their common space. This sometimes may seem like a win-win, you get Jesus and coffee, the two things that keep most of our lives functioning. However, Catholics do not do this. We do not bring coffee, food, or drinks to mass and the reason is that we are making room for Jesus.

We fast for the Lord that by making room for him in our bodies, we would also make room for Jesus in our hearts. Another way to say this is that the actions that we do have effects upon our hearts and souls. The fast for mass is meant to foster our hunger for the Lord. We read in scripture that “man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.”

The Church has the hour fast before mass. This is a shorter time of fasting than what it used to be. However, the purpose remains the same that by fasting from food and drink for an hour before communion we are seeking to foster our hunger for Jesus. The Lord also tells us, “Do not labor for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give to you.” Jesus Christ is the food that sustains us to eternal life. We do still

need regular food to nourish our earthly bodies, but we also need Jesus to feed us. We fast for that time before mass to remind ourselves of our need for Jesus’ body and blood to be fed with the bread of life.

This is why as Catholics we fast from food and drink before mass and communion so that we can make room in our bodies and our hearts to welcome Jesus who is the Bread of Life.
