

Prepare the Soil

We have in our gospel this Sunday the parable of the seed sown on good soil. We are all probably very familiar with this parable and its explanation. We need to produce fruit if we are to be Jesus' disciples and heirs to the kingdom. So, the reflection for us is how do we change the soil of our hearts to become fertile and fruitful because our hearts do not begin as fertile soil.

The sacraments are not magic. They do not automatically make our hearts to become fertile soil for God's word with no effort made on our part. I have watched people farming corn and other crops where you are conscious of the fertilizer that you put on, you spray for weeds, and make sure that your equipment will run. There is work and preparation that goes into producing a bountiful harvest. Our life with the Lord is the same.

If we come at least ten minutes early to mass, it helps us to quiet our hearts from the bustle of our busy lives. If we read the scripture readings during the week for the coming Sunday, then our minds will be more open to hear Christ speak through the scriptures. If we cannot remember the last time that we came to confession, then we should go. This is the way that we clean out the thorns that can grow into our hearts. If we do these simple things, then the Lord can more easily change the soil of our hearts into fertile soil for a bountiful harvest.
