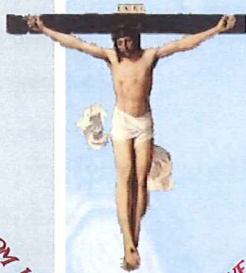

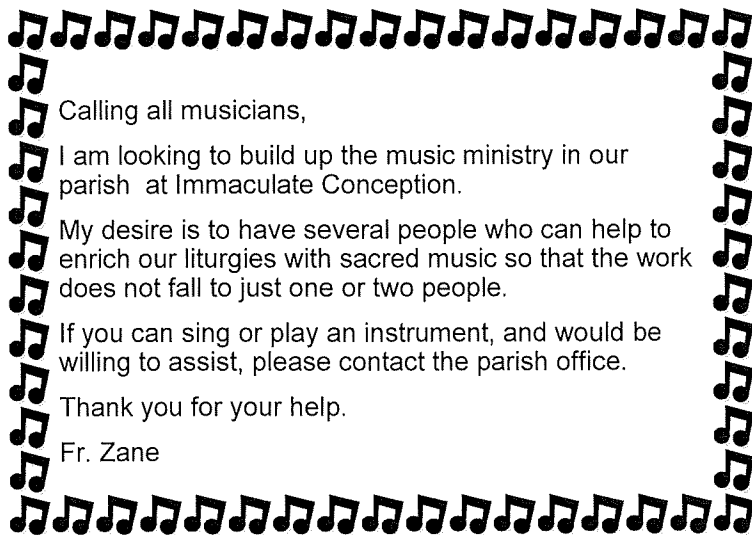

Receiving the Lord- part II

I wrote last week about some of the ways in which we can receive our Lord in the Eucharist. Just to reiterate, we may receive Jesus either on our hands or on our tongue. We also may receive either standing or kneeling. If we choose to receive on our hands, then we also check our hands afterwards to ensure that there are no crumbs of the Eucharist remaining on our hands.

I said that I would write about receiving on the tongue. It seems from my little studying that I could squeeze in this week, that receiving the Eucharist on the tongue came about later in the Church's history. I cannot give an exact year, but some sources claim that in the early Church people received on the hand and standing to symbolize that we have been raised up with Jesus through his resurrection. Then later the practice of receiving on the tongue developed to avoid people brushing crumbs off of their hands after receiving, and it made it harder for someone to steal the Eucharist. Yes, there are still people who seek to steal the Eucharist either out of ignorance or malice, and the extraordinary minister and I are keeping an eye out to prevent this.

If you wish to receive on the tongue a couple of helpful things to keep in mind. First, open your mouth wide and either stick your tongue out or bring it out to your lips. Then I or the extraordinary minister will place the host on your tongue. The host will usually always stick to your tongue, and this works better than trying to grab the host with your lips or your teeth. Secondly, when you open your mouth for me to place the Lord on your tongue, freeze. I have found when shooting or distributing communion it is easier to hit a stationary target rather than a moving one.

If you have gone to mass at Saint Isidore in Colome, you may have wondered why there is a pair of kneelers placed in front of the sanctuary. They are there to allow people the opportunity to kneel to receive if they wish, or people may stand if they wish. Those kneelers are not seeking to force people to do one option or the other, rather they are to make it easier for people to receive the Lord in a way that helps them to remember who they are receiving. I have also commissioned a set of kneelers to be made for our church of Immaculate Conception for those same reasons.

When researching for this page, I wanted to also touch a little on the meaning behind the gestures of standing or kneeling in the liturgy (public worship). Since we are both body and soul, the postures that we do to pray and worship also help to proclaim and inform our worship. According to Benedict XVI in his book *The Spirit of the Liturgy*, the posture of kneeling points to humility and adoration of the glory of God. In the act of kneeling, we are humbling ourselves to recognize our dependence upon God while looking up to God and gazing toward the one that we want to go to. Standing is an ancient posture for prayer. It demonstrates a readiness to be sent out as well as victory, that we have been raised up in Christ.

When we come forward to receive our Lord in the Eucharist, whether we choose to receive on the hands or tongue while we are standing or kneeling, we are seeking to remember Who we are receiving. We are not trying to draw attention to ourselves nor look down on our brothers or sisters in the way that he or she chooses to receive. For we are all beggars before the Lord who come to receive the great gift that he bestows upon us. We pray that we may always treasure and long for the gift of our Lord given in the Eucharist.
