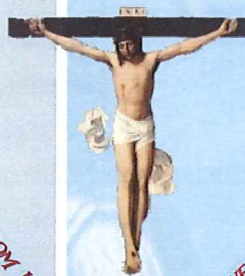

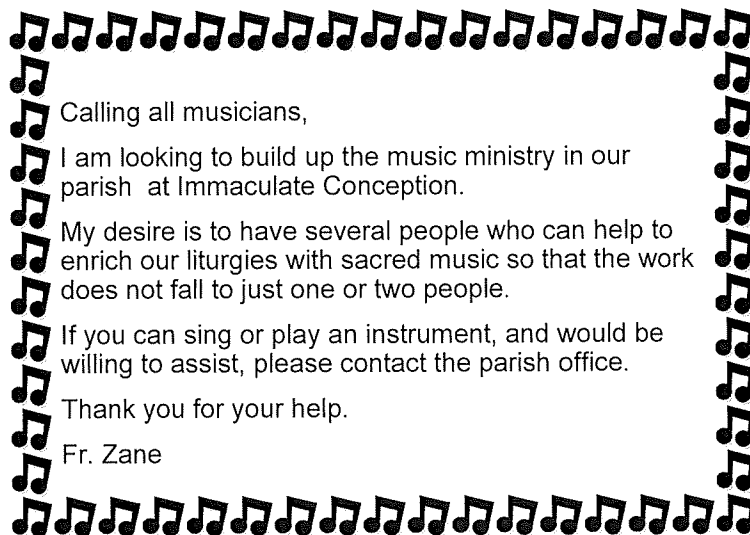

The requests of our mother

I am often humbled and astounded by the things that I get to encounter as a priest. I am blessed to be a part of people's lives in a far more intimate way than I ever would have imagined. I get to be part of their families at the joys of baptisms and weddings and the grief of dying and funerals, and truth be told, in those moments they are not seeking Zane Pekron, they want Jesus to be present. I get the blessing of being the instrument to help make Jesus present to them in a very concrete way.

There is also the experience of people asking me for prayers. They want me to intercede to the Lord on their behalf for the intentions that are weighing on their hearts, which I am honored and happy to do. I have asked on a couple of occasions, why is there such a strong desire for me to pray for these intentions for you. The sense that I have gotten from the answers is something like, "you have the inside track, or since you are a priest, the Lord hears and answers your prayers." Another way to say it is people have this instinct that the role of the priest is to be a mediator between God and man. He is to bring their prayers to God and pour out God's blessings upon them. This role gets played out by both the sacraments and by his prayers.

The priest as a good mediator is meant to be holy, the people of God deserve a saintly priest, but the Lord knowing the priests that the people get are often far less than saints. God has made it so that the effectiveness of the sacraments is not based upon the holiness of the priest. In other words, you can have the most wretched priest or one who is in the state of mortal sin, but so long as he uses the proper matter and form for the sacraments, that grace is brought to the people. The grace of the sacraments is not reliant upon the holiness of the minister.

However, the prayers and intercessions that a priest makes are reliant upon his personal holiness. We can see this in stories of many of the saints where the Lord answered their prayers, even in very spectacular ways. It is not magic meaning, it is not a formula where I do A, or I get such saintly person to say or do B in order that God may grant petition C. It is a relationship and the closer that someone is to the Lord, the more that we can see the Lord listening and answering their prayers.

This is why I believe that Jesus gave his mother, Mary, to be our mother while he hung upon the cross. We can bring our prayers to Jesus ourselves. We can also ask Mary to bring our prayers and intercessions to her son on our behalf. The requests of a mother have a special place in the heart of her son(s). It is the same with Jesus. We can see this play out in the story of the wedding feast at Cana. Mary tells Jesus that they have no wine left at the wedding, and she then instructs the servants to do whatever Jesus tells them. Jesus performs his first miracle in changing water into wine. When we bring our prayers to Mary, it does not take away from Jesus. She delights to bring our prayers and intercessions to her son, and she delights to help us come to know and love her son in a more profound way.

We priests get the blessing of being a mediator between God and man. Jesus delights in using his mother to be a mediator as well. I am happy to pray for my people and their intentions. I enjoy bringing the needs, prayers, and desires of people to Jesus, but if you want the person who truly has the "inside track" so to speak, go to mom. Jesus has given Mary to be our mother, and she delights in bringing our prayers to her son.
