The Cross, the Tree of Life

The greatest gifts that I have ever received from the Lord, I never would have dreamed to ask for because they did not seem like blessings at face value. The most life-changing gifts that the Lord has given me has been different occasions of getting to share in his cross. It is easy to write about the beauty of the cross and the gift of it when I am not hanging from it. This is one of the things that I think is so scandalous is that he made the tree of torture into the tree of life.

The language of the cross is incomprehensible to our world today. The goal of our culture today is to seek pleasure and to avoid pain. We do this in a variety of ways from the comforts that we seek, food, relationships, etc., and we seek at all costs to avoid as much pain and suffering as possible. I think that this is because our culture has rejected Jesus as a whole, so pain and suffering have no meaning. Suffering in itself is not good, but because Jesus embraced the cross, when we accept a share in his cross, we encounter him in an unveiled way. It is unveiled because the cross strips away our facade, we quit putting our best foot forward, so we come to Jesus as we are. It shows us that Jesus is not in love with our facade, he sees the real me, and it is that me, that he loves.

When we are offered a share in the cross, when we undergo whatever suffering the Lord chooses or allows in our life, we have a choice. This choice is personified through the two thieves in Luke 23: 33-43. The one thief dies cursing the cross and the God who will not get him down from it. While the other looks to Jesus and says, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." It is only the one who keeps looking to Jesus who is promised paradise. When we are hanging from the cross, when we are in the midst of suffering, it is hard to turn our eyes towards Christ. In those moments, God often seems distant and all that we can see is our own suffering, but Jesus is right there next to us. He remains close to us.

The cross also stretches my capacity to love. It tears open and expands my heart as it strips away my selfishness, self-centeredness, and makes many of my coping comforts seem bland and tasteless. Just as Jesus was stripped of his garments before he was crucified, so when we are nailed to the cross next to Jesus, he uses it as a way to strip away those things that lead us away from him. This crucifixion with the Lord also purifies my love for Jesus. It begs the question of will I still love him; rather do I love Jesus more than the consolations and gifts that he gives to me.

If the cross is such a gift, then why do we resist it so much? Why do I spend so much time trying to run from and avoid the cross? The simple answer is that the selfish parts of me do not want to die. I like to stay where it is comfortable; yet Jesus always invites us to more. He invites me to deeper intimacy (knowing and being known by him), and in order for me to receive those gifts, he has to stretch my small heart to receive them. It is similar to the process of purifying gold. The way that you purify gold is you heat it beyond its melting point. As it liquifies, and continues to be heated, the impurities rise to the surface where they may be skimmed off. So too, the cross works to purify and strip away the impurities in our hearts; they may be pure.

The ultimate scandal of the cross is that Jesus took all of the suffering and pain that is part of our fallen experience, and he transformed it into the means to life with him. Without Jesus suffering is meaningless and to be avoided at all costs. However, the greatest blessings that Jesus gives are a share in his cross with him. When we seek to keep our gaze fixed on him then he will take us from the suffering of the cross to the glory of the resurrection.
