Giving myself away

"Then God said: Let us make man in our image, after our likeness." (Gen1:26) We are made after the image and likeness of God who is a communion of persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The Vatican II document "Gaudium et Spes (GS)" expounds upon the meaning that we are made in God's likeness. "This likeness reveals that man, who is the only creature on earth which God willed for itself, cannot fully find himself except through a sincere gift of himself. (GS 24)" There are a variety of ways to say this, but simply put, we become who we are meant to be by giving ourselves away in a gift of love.

This idea of giving ourselves away to become everything we are meant to be seems backwards to our secular culture. There is this idea that I must figure out myself, and make sure that I don't give more of myself than I can comfortably afford. The secular world tells us to first ask, "What is in it for me?" This worldview that is separated from the design of the creator has created a world that is rich in goods, but empty of meaning.

Our second reading attests to the faith of the Patriarchs, and the astounding wonders that God did through their faith. "But without faith it is impossible to please God, for anyone who approaches God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him. (Heb11:6)"

I have preached the last couple of Sundays about giving ourselves to the Lord. That prayer helps us to grow closer to the Lord, and share everything in our life with Jesus, not just our strengths. Prayer also helps us to see that our giving to the Lord is a response to his abundant and total gift to us. The thing for us to ponder is what kind of a gift do we give to the Lord?

For all of you who are here at mass this weekend, you made an intentional commitment that you want to give this hour on Sunday to the Lord. When we take time to pray, do we carve out time or pray when we have time? Do we tithe? Do we intentionally give a portion of our income to the Lord, even if it is small, or do we give of what is left over? Do we seek to share our talents with the Lord and His Church? When we give of our time, talent, and treasure, are we intentional about what and how we give, or do we give what is left over?

We find ourselves by giving ourselves away in love. This gift of ourselves shows the creator whose image we bear. I'm not proclaiming a prosperity gospel, "give and everything will go perfectly." However, God is never out done in generosity. If we give ourselves generously to him, then he will respond even more generously to us. When we give of ourselves in love, we become everything that we were created to be.
