

## Admonish the Sinner

“Judge not, lest you yourself be judged.” This seems to be the quote for our age. This idea that not only should we not judge others, but that it is best to let each person choose for himself or herself what is best. This seems at face value to be good, or at least the easiest. However, to tolerate another does not fulfill the command of the Lord to love your neighbor as yourself.

The Lord tells Ezekiel that he will make him a watchman for the house of Israel. He also informs Ezekiel that if God tells him that a wicked man shall die for his sins, and Ezekiel does not warn the wicked man, then Ezekiel will be held responsible for the wicked man’s death. Ezekiel becomes the example for admonishing the sinner, which is a spiritual work of mercy. This does not mean using the scriptures as a club to bludgeon sinners into compliance with God’s commandments. While that may be easier for us, it is not very effective, especially in our current world that we live in. What admonishing the sinner means is teaching and seeking to draw someone away from something that is going to or is causing their spiritual death.

An example of this is parents who teach their kids not to play in the street. When they are young you teach them that they cannot do it. Then as they get older and can understand more, you explain to them why playing in the street is dangerous to them. It is not only that they could get injured, but it is life or death. Our spiritual life can be like this as well. There are things in the spiritual life that can injure us and there are other actions that are like playing tag on a busy freeway. The challenge with the spiritual life is that our injuries are not always immediately apparent to us as they are to our physical body. The Lord will work through our conscience to inform us that something is wrong, but if our conscience is not well formed then we may not hear the warning.

So, if God is merciful, why is it important to admonish the sinner? Won’t God just let everyone into heaven? Scripture would tell us that not everyone is universally brought into heaven. “Strive to enter through the narrow door. For many, I tell you, will seek to enter and will not be able” (Luke 13:24). The reality of heaven and hell is that they do exist, and our choices now set the course for our eternal destination. This is why our choices matter so much in this life because they decide our final end. When this life is over, we will not be able to go back to change our minds. Therefore, we admonish the sinner, call them away from spiritual danger, so that all of us can enter together through the narrow door to the joys of heaven.

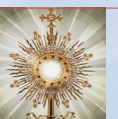
