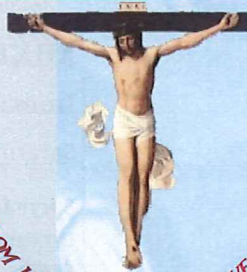

## Putting on your Sunday Best

We are people of rituals. We have ways of doing things, and ways that we like to do various things. If you do not believe me, go help a farmer or rancher and suggest doing the project differently than the way things have always been done. You might get a strong response.

It is not a bad thing to have rituals. They help us to do various things without using much energy or thought focused on those things. They give us a sense of stability. Our culture scoffs at traditions and rituals as outdated and old fashioned. However, we cannot function without them. Another thing that rituals do is they help us to know what to expect, and they prepare us for the thing that we are anticipating. They set the tone in our mind of how important the thing is that we are getting ready for.

One of the practices that people used to do is dress up for Sunday Mass. I know that there are still people who do this, but it is a lesser practiced ritual. When I say people would dress up for mass, I mean that people had their nice clothes that they wore to Church. The men might wear a tie, a jacket, or both. The women might wear a nice dress or some other formal attire. When you think about the various things that you dress for, do you dress specially for mass or not?

The question though is, why? Why go through the extra work to dress special for mass? Does Jesus really care about what I wear to church, isn't it enough that I am there? He is glad that you are there, but the extra effort of dressing nicer than your regular, going to town outfits, helps you. The first is that we dress nicer when we are going to meet someone important. We get to receive the King of the Universe into our body; you cannot get anymore important than that. The second thing this does for us is it changes how we think about what we are doing. It helps to solidify in our minds that this is something special, something different than everything else that we will do this week. The act of dressing up for mass gives God greater glory. It also prepares our minds and hearts that something special happens here that is different from the rest of our week.

I'm not saying that everyone must now go out and buy a three-piece suit. However, when you are choosing what you want to wear to mass, do you choose something special, or do you grab whatever is available. I challenge you that if you start dressing special for mass, then after a while, mass will take on more of a special character for you. It begins to take on more of a special importance in your mind than it might have before. If you are not in the habit of dressing up for mass, then give it a try for a couple of months to see how it changes the way that you think about what happens on the altar.
