

## The Word became Flesh.

This is one of the great mysteries of our faith. That the Word of God, the second person of the Trinity, took on our humanity and became man. We speak about Jesus as the Word of God for it was through him that God created the world and everything in it. "Let there be light, and light was made." This spoken Word is the one who came to reveal the Father to us. We speak about the incarnation as remembering an event of the past. We also have a way in which the mass remembers the incarnation and makes it present to us.

We begin with the liturgy of the Word. We hear the Lord speak to us through his word, through the readings and we respond to them. Then when we move into the liturgy of the Eucharist, that Word spoken at the ambo becomes flesh on the altar. Jesus' body and blood become present on the altar under the appearance of bread and wine. This is why the Church structures her mass as she does, beginning with the readings and ending with receiving the Eucharist.

So, when we come to mass to be fed and nourished, remember that the Lord wants to feed us both with his Word and Body in the mass. The Word who speaks through the readings is the same Word that becomes flesh on the altar.

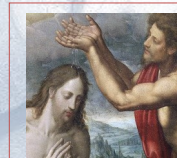

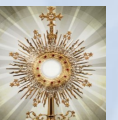
