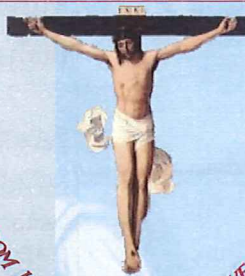

A Safe Environment for Children and Young People

All Souls Day

Why does the Church pray for the dead? This is a common question that our culture does not understand. Many people in our world and culture say that if the deceased just goes to God and eternal glory in heaven, why do we need to pray for them.

The Church's practice of praying for the dead on All Souls day (November 2) and all other days of the year is an ancient practice. We look to the scriptures for our call to pray for the dead (2 Maccabees 12:32-45). When we read that story, we hear that what Judas did for his soldiers was right and just that they should pray that their sin be blotted out. We also pray that all the departed would be purified so that they may enter heaven. This is because nothing impure can enter heaven.

St. Thomas Aquinas taught that purgatory achieves three things: forgiveness of venial sins, purification of sinful inclinations, and the removal of the temporal punishment due to sin. Temporal punishment of sin can also be described as "moral debt" because our sins not only offend God, but they also do harm to us and to others. God is the one who purifies the soul of these things, but our prayers are that God would quicken and help them in this process of purification.

All Souls day and the month of November are special times in which to pray for the dead; yet we can pray for them all year long. I encourage you to take a little time this month to pray a rosary in a cemetery for the departed. We do this not only to help those who have died, but also so that our children and others will pray for us when we die. We are not in this journey of faith alone. We work together to assist one another with our prayers so that they in turn can assist us with their prayers as well.
