Topic: The 4 Last Things

Death, Judgement, Heaven, Hell

Looking at the painted image of the Last Judgement, it seems like a noisy, clamoring, chaotic mix of humans, angels, devils, and souls. All this activity is centered on the risen Christ, who comes to judge the living and the dead. He is the One to whom each must give an account of his life. Some are seized with terror, others hide their faces in shame, some extend their hands to Him like beggars. It makes us reflect upon where and how we will stand before the judgement seat of Christ in the certainty of this coming day. He will make us see his Truth, and all that is false, all that is hidden in us will be revealed. Each will be assigned his place for Eternity, those who lived righteously will inherit eternal life, and those who were unrighteous, a place among the damned. This coming day is precisely the point of why we live our Catholic faith, why we worship, why we receive instruction, and why we fervently pray.

During her stormy adolescence, she tried to convince a Christian missionary that there is no God but was converted to Christ instead. While attending a Turkish university and serving as a Christian youth minister, Derya began to compare the teachings of Protestantism and Catholicism, and during her doctoral studies in England, she entered the Catholic Church. Little has an MA in History and a PhD in Politics. She has written articles for academic journals, Catholic World Report, Crisis Magazine and other Catholic publications. Her conversion story, From Islam to Christ, is published by Ignatius Press.

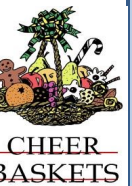
Angel Tree Ministry
